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Figure 1. Total Number of Clients Served by the Brown County CRC Since 2003

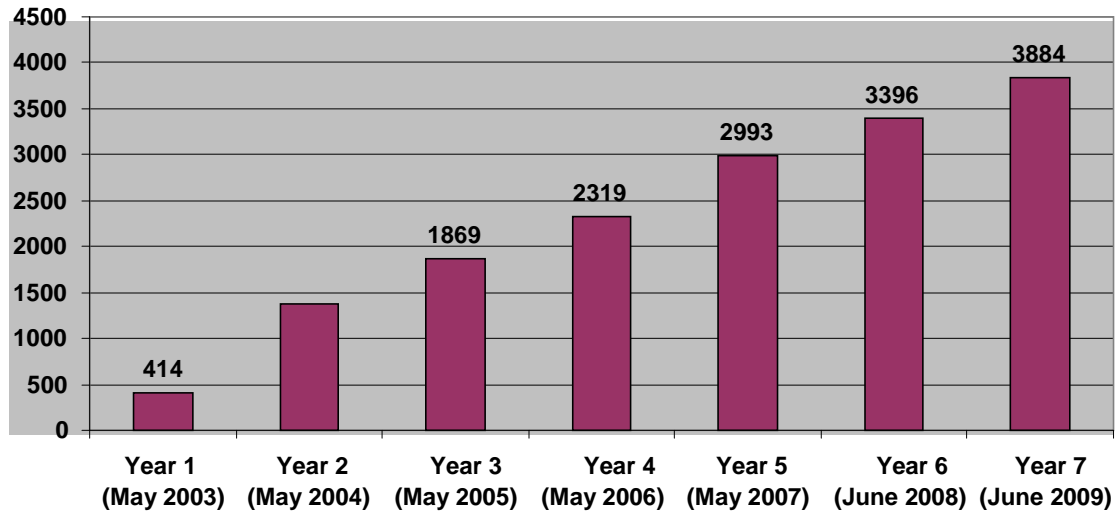

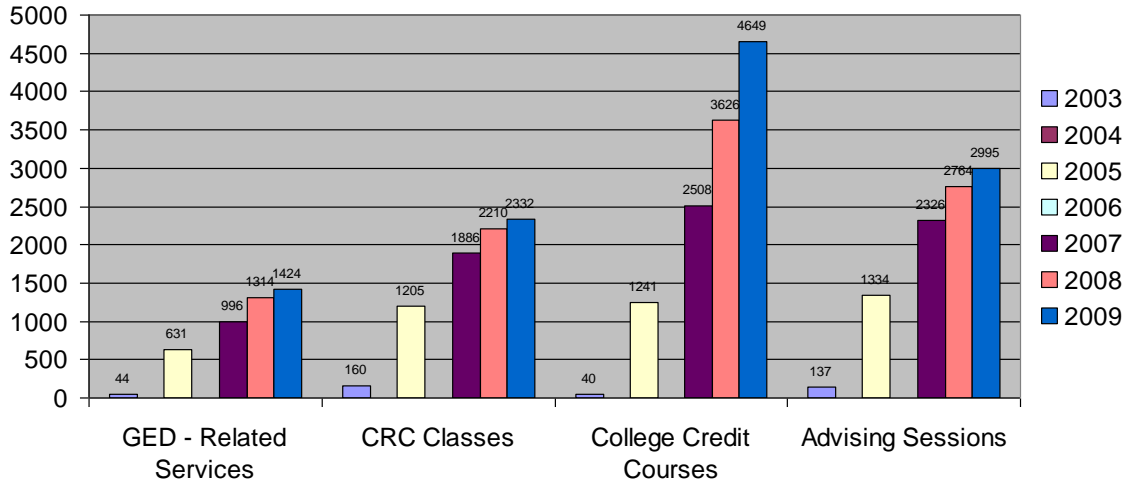

Perceived Barriers to CRC Use

Of the clients who provided data about barriers that could affect their ability to use CRC services:

- 17% reported childcare as a potential barrier.
- 38% reported transportation as a potential barrier.
- 33% reported finances as a potential barrier.
- 12% reported scheduling as a potential barrier.

Figure 3. Percentage Use of CRC Services Since 2002

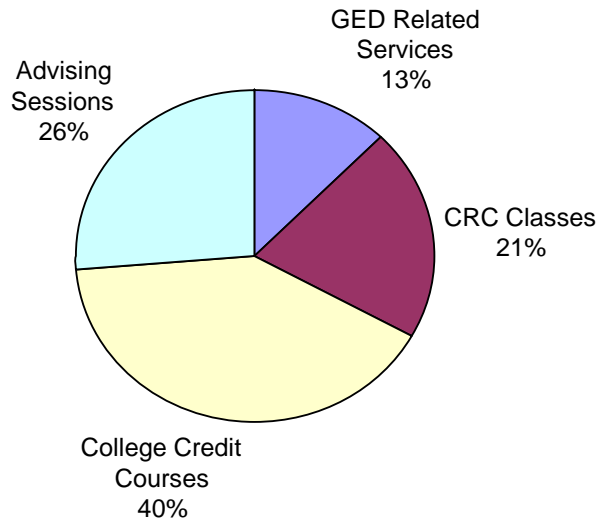


Figure 4. Number of College Courses Conducted at the CRC Each Semester Since Fall 2002

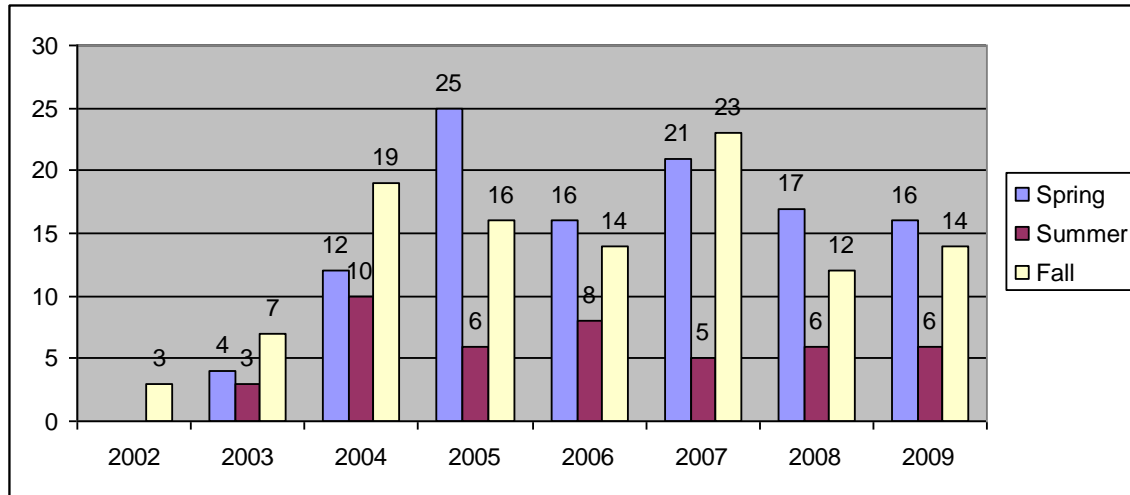

Figure 5. Course Completion Rates for CRC and Ivy Tech Columbus (2007-2009)

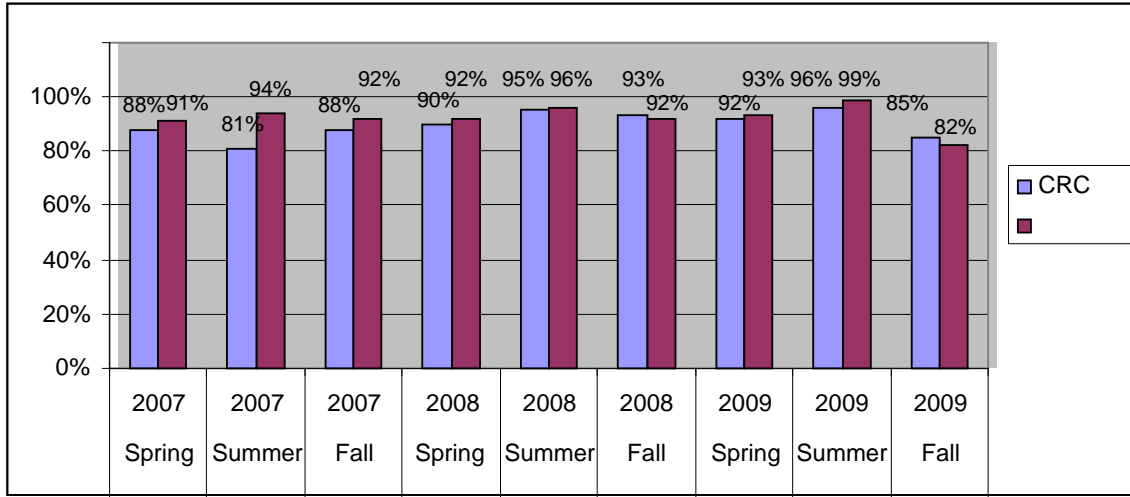


Figure 6. Number of GED Tests Attempted and/or Passed by Year

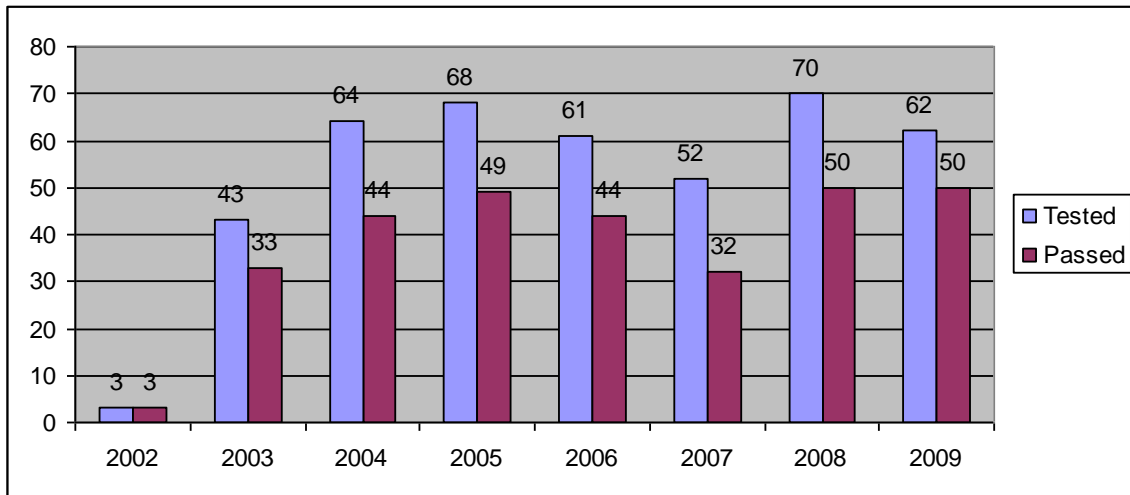


Figure 8. Cumulative Number of CRC Clients Taking the GED Tests Each Year
