## Aravon McCalla

2011 Hall of Fame Inductee Aravon McCalla is a 2002 graduate of Brown County High School. He is the son of Dr. Charles X. McCalla IV and Teri Ann Bleuel, Esq. Aravon grew up on Somerset Lake near Nashville and attended the Bloomington Montessori School as an elementary student. During his high school career, Aravon earned four varsity letters each in cross country and track. During his cross country career at Brown County High School, Aravon was a four time all-conference selection and the 2000 conference champion. In addition, he was an instrumental part of three state finalist cross country teams and a 2001 academic all-state selection. As a track athlete, Aravon claimed eight conference titles, six sectional titles, was a four time state qualifier, and a 2002 academic all-state selection. In addition to these accomplishments, Aravon was the 2002 Valedictorian and Golden Eagle Award Winner.

After graduation, Aravon attended Indiana University where he earned an undergraduate degree in Biology and a Doctor of Jurisprudence from the Indiana University School of Law graduating cum laude in 2008. He is currently a third year medical student at the Indiana University School of Medicine and an MBA student at the Kelly School of Business at IUPUI. He was recently engaged to Jada Roberts who is currently enrolled in the Indiana University School of Dentistry.
